Finding Resources

To find online resources, search the UD Library Hub using the **Discover Articles and More** and **Discover Books and eBooks** buttons on the home page of the UD Library Hub. A search using these buttons will present you with full text access to online journal articles and eBooks in the Library Hub. Use the *Find and Access* or *Research* dropdown lists to find databases and journals. Books held by UD libraries and other libraries within Australia and overseas are also shown when searching for books and eBooks. The *Libraries Worldwide* option can be turned off for individual searches. Note that access to libraries may be restricted in your area.

The University of Divinity Library Hub now subscribes to Lean Library, a browser extension that provides seamless access to Library Hub subscription resources and open access content from anywhere on the Web: <https://youtu.be/z-0a9PqN7Rs> It can be downloaded here: <https://library.divinity.edu.au/lean-library.html>, or you can access it from the Home page of the Library Hub. You will need to scroll down the download page to find your Web browser if you don't use Google Chrome. Once the download is complete, select University of Divinity from the list and log in using your ARK login.

Most of the required eBooks and articles for your unit/s will either be supplied by the lecturer or made available in ARK or the Library Hub. State and national libraries also provide access to various online databases and other resources for members, so it may be a good idea to join.

Copyright information

Australian Copyright regulations require that an educational institution reproduce no more than 10%, or one chapter, of any book, whichever is the greater; or one article from any journal (the exception being that if there is a second article on the same subject it may also be reproduced) for distribution to students during the semester. This applies across all units, meaning that only one chapter of any book may be reproduced by the institution during the semester.

THE SAME CONSTRAINTS APPLY TO STUDENTS. Each student may reproduce, for example, only one chapter from *An Introduction to the Old Testament Historical Books* (or 10% of the book, whichever is the greater number of pages) during the semester, regardless of whether he/she needs a second chapter for another assignment. Reproduction includes photocopying, scanning, and photographing.

The same rules apply to online materials unless additional rights have been given.
