Postgraduate Certificate in Divinity



 If you don't have a university degree but you have acquired – as a minimum – five years of relevant work/professional experience, you can apply to study at Postgraduate level by first completing a Postgraduate Certificate in Divinity, and then progress up to higher awards.

AWARDS IN MORE DETAIL

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY

1 year full-time, or up to 4 years part-time

Consists of 8 undergraduate units (144 points) and introduces students to the key theological disciplines of Biblical Studies, Theology and History, and provides options for electives in other areas of study.

ADVANCED DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY AND MINISTRY

2 years full-time, or up to 8 years part-time

Consists of 16 units (288 points) and builds on the Diploma in Theology by enabling students to deepen their understanding of the theological disciplines.

BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY

3 years full-time, or up to 9 years part-time

Consists of 24 units (432 points) and enables students to develop knowledge across broad areas of theology, as well as depth in areas of interest.

CROSS-INSTITUTIONAL STUDY & SINGLE SUBJECT STUDIES

If you are already undertaking study at another university, either as undergraduate or postgraduate, did you know that you may be able study units at SAC as part of your award? Contact us about the possibility of **CROSS-INSTITUTIONAL STUDY**, or check with your current institution about the flexibility of choosing electives at SAC as cross-institutional study. Studying theology is a great way for one to deepen their faith and knowledge of Christian tradition and to serve in the mission of the Church. So why not consider taking up a Diploma or Bachelor in Theology alongside your current award?

Interested in studying a unit and completing all the required assessment tasks but don't intend to complete a full course of study? Considering enrolling in a **SINGLE SUBJECT** unit.

POSTGRADUATE COURSEWORK PROGRAMS

GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN THEOLOGY

1 semester full-time, or up to 3 semesters part-time

Consists of 3 units (72 points) of Postgraduate Foundational units in three Disciplines from at least two fields.

GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN DIVINITY

1 semester full-time, or up to 3 semesters part-time

Consists of 3 units (72 points) of Postgraduate Foundational units in three Disciplines from any number of fields.

GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY

1 year full-time, or up to 3 years part-time

Consists of 6 foundational and elective units (144 points) comprising of 3 units minimum (72 points) in foundational units (Level 8) in three disciplines across two fields. The remaining 3 units (72 points) are to be taken from foundational (Level 8) or elective units (Level 9).

GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN DIVINITY

1 year full-time, or up to 3 years part-time

Consists of 6 units (144 points) that may comprise of Level 8 or Level 9 units in any field or discipline. It is designed to allow students to explore multiple areas of interest in divinity and its associated disciplines, or to engage with one or two areas in depth.

MASTER OF THEOLOGICAL STUDIES

2 years full-time, or up to 6 years part-time


Consists of 12 units (288 points) and enables students to apply an advanced body of knowledge in theology and its associated disciplines.

MASTER OF DIVINITY

3 years full-time, or up to 9 years part-time

Consists of 18 units (432 points) and offers a distinct emphasis on integration, research and theological reflection.

HIGHER DEGREES BY RESEARCH

Two Higher Degrees by Research (HDR) are available to suitably qualified candidates at St Athanasius College.

Research degrees are undertaken under supervision of two appropriately accredited research-active supervisors, one of whom must be a faculty member of the University of Divinity. The following degrees are open to graduates of at least four years of full-time tertiary study, including at least one year of study in theology or an associated discipline.

MASTER OF PHILOSOPHY

18 months full-time, or 4 years part-time

This degree is designed for individuals who bring a foundation within this disciplinary range. It consists of a 40,000-word thesis and attendance at 8 hours of postgraduate seminars per annum.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY

3 years full-time, or 8 years part-time

3 years full-time, or 8 years part-time. The award qualifies individuals who apply a substantial body of knowledge to research, investigate and develop new knowledge, in one or more areas of investigation, scholarship or professional practice. It requires a major piece of directed research through a thesis of 100,000 words.

ADMISSION CRITERIA INTO HDR awards: Successful completion of RQ9748M Minor Thesis (16,000 words) and either RQ9021Z Research Methodologies or DP9734W Human Research Methodologies (for human based research) are prerequisites for admission to Higher Degree by Research award. The Minor Thesis can be included in any of the pathways indicated above. A Minor Thesis result of 75% or above is required for HDR applications.

AUDIT OF COURSEWORK

If you are curious to learn about some of our unit offerings, you are welcome to access our learning environment as an audit student on a not-for-credit basis. This means you can attend and participate in classroom discussions or online forums where you can listen to recorded lectures and download study materials, without the need to fulfill the assessment requirements to earn credit towards an academic award. Please note, however, that assessments cannot be submitted or marked and no feedback can be given on your work or progress. For a small fee of \$550 per unit – payable directly to St Athanasius College – this wonderful opportunity provides professional development and further learning opportunities. Supervised Reading Unit

With the approval of the Academic Dean, students may undertake specialised studyas part of their postgraduate courses--with the guidance of an appropriate, researchactive supervisor in a Supervised Reading Unit (SRU).

The content, learning outcomes, bibliography and type of assessment will be proposed by the student in consultation with a supervisor (member of faculty) and finally approved by the Academic Dean. Students taking a supervised reading unit (SRU) will be required to meet with their supervisor at least once a month.

In addition to the re-enrolment procedure, an SRU Approval Template must be completed by the student and supervisor and submitted for approval to the SAC Academic Dean at least one week prior to the semester census date. Students may link this unit and its assessment tasks to an existing unit or participation or presentation in a scholarly conference during the semester in which the unit is taken.

In consultation with the supervisor, students may audit a coursework unit that may be related to an SRU to guide their reading, thinking and writing.

Minor Thesis

The purpose of the 16,000-word Minor Thesis is to demonstrate advanced theoretical knowledge in one or more disciplines. Students undertake their research with a suitably qualified, researchactive supervisor in the chosen discipline of study.

Eligible students may apply to enrol in a 16,000-word minor thesis (worth 2 units) either as a single subject enrolment or as part of a postgraduate coursework award. Students may elect to take the Minor Thesis in a single semester or across two consecutive semesters.

Students should discuss the option of undertaking a Minor Thesis with the Research Co-ordinator during the semester prior to enrolling in the Minor Thesis. Students who have agreed on a research topic with a qualified supervisor may enrol in the Minor Thesis at the beginning of the semester.

Completion of a 16,000-word Minor Thesis Outline that has been reviewed and agreed together with the supervisor, must be sent electronically to the Academic Dean for approval at least one week prior to the census date of the semester in which the Minor Thesis commences.

TUITION FEES IN 2025

Unit Fees

Tuition fees are set each year by the University of Divinity and are standard across all the colleges of the University. Fees are charged on the basis of a "unit fee" which covers the teaching for one unit of study for one semester. This fee is all inclusive and covers tuition, library access and student facilities.

Undergraduate (Diploma/degree): \$2,109 per 18-point unit

Postgraduate: \$3,268 per 24-point unit

Audit of Coursework: \$550 per unit

Fee Payment Options

Students have a number of fee payment options depending on the course or unit in which they are enrolled.

UPFRONT PAYMENT: Students can choose to pay upfront by credit card, EFT or Swift.


ONLINE: Students can now pay their fees online via the University's payment portal: https://pay.divinity.edu.au/ Select"Tuition Fee".
